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ENROLMENT – WHAT’S IT ALL ABOUT?

Each BBNI company takes a different approach to enrolment. Having chatted to many Chaplains and leaders, we’ve put together this resource to help you understand the ethos behind the enrolment and to offer suggestions for how you can maximise the opportunity.

Ask any leader or minister about the enrolment and you’ll get a totally different answer.

An enrolment is not an essential part of the BBNI programme, but it does present a huge opportunity for BBNI leaders to work with their Chaplain to create an exciting enrolment event for BBNI members and their families.

Enrolment is totally separate to registration. Anyone wishing to serve in a BBNI company, or within a battalion, must be registered with The Northern Ireland Boys’ Brigade (BBNI). If your church chooses not to have an enrolment, your leadership is not affected.

We know from talking to leaders, that many of our members do not have any other church connection. An enrolment provides a fantastic opportunity to welcome the members and their families to church and can encourage them to attend again. It’s a real opportunity to families to hear the gospel and connect with the wider activities of the church. As every BBNI company is part of a church or Christian organisation it’s vital that the chaplain/ minister is involved in the design of the service, after all, it is part of the witness of the church.

The context of each church community and BBNI company will be different. Each denomination will have elements that are integral in any church service. In respecting the normal elements of church services across many denominations, this resource provides guidance and suggestions for maximising the opportunity to advance Christ’s Kingdom through an enrolment.

MAXIMISING THE OPPORTUNITY

Parents, families and friends of our young people.

You should consider how to make the most of this opportunity, as it may be one of the rare occasions when this particular group attends church. The purpose of the service is not to dwell on nostalgic memories, cherish old hymns, or get lost in traditions. The most important thing is to show them what church is really like, welcome them warmly, and deliver a gospel message to our children, young people, parents, and everyone present.

Wider church

It’s important to involve the wider church membership and ensure that they are encouraged to attend the service. In addition to getting involved with welcoming guests at the door or helping with hospitality, they can pray for the service.

Hospitality

“True hospitality consists of giving the best of yourself to your guests.”
Eleanor Roosevelt.

How do you want visitors to feel when they come to your church? Imagine this is your family and you are welcoming them to your house to celebrate together.

A good cup of coffee or a tasty treat can make people smile! Consider how you could offer hospitality to encourage relationships to be developed with the young people, their families, and friends. Here are some suggestions:

- **Tea & Coffee** –served before or after the service
- **Sweet Treats** – why not think beyond the custard cream and offer desserts, cakes, cookies, ice cream, doughnuts – why not ask the boys for ideas?
- **Breakfast, Lunch or Dinner** – depending on the timing of you service you could offer soup, bacon baps, pizza, sandwiches, burgers, hotdogs

Make sure you add this to the invitation, let people know you’d love them to stay and enjoy hospitality.

Being an integral part of the Youth & Children’s Ministry of the church

BBNI is part of the youth and children’s ministry of the church. Many children and young people have no connection with church apart from attending Boys’ Brigade. The service creates an opportunity to introduce them to more aspects of the church and it may be useful to promote other church activities.

Daisy Chain

Think about the daisy chain approach, linking a series of events, people, or activities to highlight how they are connected. For example:

- A member of Anchors/Juniors who attends BBNI every week could attend Sunday School, then to the Church nativity, and then to the Holiday Bible Club.
- A member of Company/Seniors who attends BBNI every week can be linked to Youth Fellowship, then to the Church youth weekend, and then to Youth Week.
- A parent who brings their child to BBNI every week will hopefully come to the enrolment service. Are you running an Alpha or Christianity Explored course? You could invite them. What about the Christmas Carol services, Good Friday and Easter Sunday services? What about the Christmas Day family service?

The Main Thing - Gospel Message

“The main thing is to keep the main thing the main thing” Stephen Covey

The purpose of BBNI is the advancement of Christ’s Kingdom. BBNI doesn’t hold the monopoly on this and partners with the church to achieve our purpose. The central focus of the enrolment service is Jesus and offering those attending the opportunity to hear the

gospel. When planning the service think about the audience, how best can present the gospel through worship, prayer, readings, drama, testimonies and Bible teaching?

PREPARATION

Prayer

In 1 Thessalonians 5:17 Paul encourages us to 'pray without ceasing.' We want God to move powerfully through Boys' Brigade. An enrolment is an opportunity to bring people to church, maybe for the first time. In addition to involving the church members in praying for the service, leaders may want to provide some specific prayer points.

Meeting together with church leadership to agree the purpose and format of the enrolment.

The form of service is a matter for the church leadership. The most effective enrolment services happen when the church leadership and the leaders of the BBNI company come together to agree when the purpose and format of the enrolment. This will include agreeing when the service will be held, what elements will be included and how it can be an effective ministry tool.

Put yourself in the shoes of a child/ young person or parent who has never been to church before. What sort of welcome will the family receive? How will they know where to sit? How will they know what to expect? How will they know when to stand? What about other siblings? What words are used in the service – will they understand what they mean?

Preparing your company

Take the children and young people into the church before the enrolment. Explain what will happen, where they will sit, where participants will stand, what happens if they need to go to the toilet? Show them where their parents/ carers will sit.

Communication with parents/ carers

Your invitation to parents/ carers should give as much useful information as possible. For example:

- Service time – both start time and likely finish time
- Make sure parents/ carers know that guests are welcome
- Is there tea/coffee/food afterwards?
- Let them know all BBNI members will be involved
- Where do the BBNI members meet?
- What uniform is required?
- Mention that everyone is welcome at the church and there isn't a dress code
- Is there a creche facility for younger siblings
- It may also be useful to give a brief explanation of what the enrolment is

THE ENROLMENT SERVICE

Many churches run their Boys' Brigade and Girls' Brigade enrolment together. This is a great way to celebrate the work of both organisations and pray for the leaders.

Each service will be different, depending on the church. Consider how best to involve the children and young people. This may include:

- Welcoming people at the door
- Lifting the offering
- Involving musicians and singers from BBNI in the worship
- Bible readings
- Prayers
- Drama
- Interviewing leaders and young people about BBNI
- Photo display in the hall afterwards on noticeboards of the BBNI company in action.
- Produce a highlights video to show photo and video footage
- Singing as a group (often a popular option for Anchors)
- Helping with the AV/ sound/ PowerPoint
- Talking about what happens on a company night

FAQS

Q: Our Boys' Brigade company is run by our leaders, surely we decide what happens at the enrolment?

A: BBNI is part of the ministry of the church and a BBNI company can only exist as part of a church. An enrolment is an evangelistic opportunity for the church and church leadership need to be involved. The responsibility for church services lies with the church leadership.

Q: Are colours (also to referred to as flags) an essential part of the enrolment?

A: No, every context is different. The decision rests with the individual church.

Boys' Brigade companies should not seek to dominate the event by insisting on items which others may regard as inappropriate.

Q: Are colours required to be paraded into the church with music?

A: No, every context is different. Examples of what churches have done:

- Colours positioned at the front of the service
- Colours paraded in with ceremonial music
- Colours brought in during the first worship song
- Colours aren't present during the service

The decision rests with the individual church.

Q: Must we sing 'Will your Anchor Hold?'

A: No, whilst it is a great hymn that is associated with Boys' Brigade, it does not have to be sung at an enrolment, but can be if desired. In addition to the traditional version of the hymn, many congregations have favoured a more modern version of the song <https://open.spotify.com/track/642uFQiNhGUXU5yk5Fcf6w?si=72828ed822584634>.

Q: Must we sing the vesper?

A: No, it does not need to be sung at the enrolment, but can be if desired.

Q: Are we required to parade to church?

A: Parading to church services is not compulsory or required as part of the enrolment service. If your parade takes you out of the church property, please ensure you have met the requirements of the Parades Commission and that a risk assessment has been completed.

Q: Does the enrolment have to be part of a Sunday service?

A: No, the captain and minister should work together to decide what is best. The service can be held during the church's usual morning or evening service or at a separate afternoon service on a Sunday or an evening during the week.

Q: My Chaplain/Minister has adapted the Act of Enrolment as part of the enrolment, is this allowed?

A: Within this resource we have provided a suggested Act of Enrolment. This can be amended as appropriate, or an alternative, similar version used.

Q: My Chaplain/Minister has asked the Assistant Minister to lead the Act of Enrolment and our youth & children's worker to speak at the service; should this not be our Chaplain/Minister of the company only?

A: Boys' Brigade leaders should work together with the church leadership to agree the elements of the enrolment. There are no rules about who leads the Act of Enrolment or who speaks at the service and church leadership.

Churches will approach this in a way that suits their context which may involve:

- The youth/children's worker from the church speaking at the service.
- A member of the BBNI staff team speaking at the service. Email hello@boysbrigadeni.org if you would like to arrange this.
- A speaker from a ministry organisation. There are many to choose from, for example: [Made for More](#), [Crown Jesus Ministries](#), [Scripture Union NI](#), [Child Evangelism Fellowship](#), [Logos Ministries International](#), [Hope for Youth Ministries](#)

Q: Our church would like us to have a joint Girls Brigade & Boys' Brigade enrolment service, is this allowed?

A: Yes, this can be very effective. An outline for the Act of Enrolment which suits a joint service is included.

Q: Is the National Anthem an essential part of the enrolment?

A: No every context is different. The decision rests with the individual Church leadership.

ACT OF ENROLMENT

Suggested text follows. Chaplains are welcome to amend as appropriate, to suit the context of their service. Chaplains may decide to enrol leaders-in charge of sections together and then enrol all other leaders and helpers. Alternatively, they may decide to enrol the captain first, then all leaders/ helpers together or they may enrol the captain and then all leaders and helpers together with the boys. An enrolment is not a mandatory part of membership of BBNI and chaplains can amend the act of enrolment to suit their context.

Consideration should be given to whether leaders come forward for the enrolment or stand at their seat. This format can be adapted to include Girls' Brigade if you are having a joint enrolment service.

CHAPLAIN:

Boys' Brigade is an important ministry within [insert church name] and we are delighted to welcome boys and young men to the company every [insert meeting night].

The purpose of The Northern Ireland Boys' Brigade is the advancement of Christ's Kingdom among Boys and the promotion of habits of Obedience, Reverence, Discipline, Self-respect and all that tends towards a true Christian manliness."

During this part of the service, we will enrol the leaders and boys. This simply means we acknowledge the service of the leaders and helpers, we formally welcome the boys and young men and we commit the work of Boys' Brigade into God's hands, asking his wisdom to guide us and his blessing as we work with boys and young men.

ENROLMENT OF CHAPLAIN

Some companies may ask a member of the church leadership to enrol the Chaplain.

Companies may have more than one Chaplain as there maybe multiple congregations who share the BBNI ministry together, or perhaps a youth or children's worker who is a Chaplain in addition to the minister.

Member of church leadership: Being called by God to the work of caring for and training young people, will you, by your word and example, seek in this place to create a community of Christian love through which our Saviour, Jesus Christ, may make himself known and the young people may grow in the knowledge and love of God?

Chaplain: With God's help, I will

Member of church leadership: I now enrol you as chaplain to our Boys' Brigade company.
[shakes hands]

ENROLMENT OF COMPANY PRESIDENT

Some companies have a President for their company; there is no requirement to have a company president.

Chaplain: I'd like to ask the President of our company [insert name] to come forward.

As President do you promise to continue in your support for our company and their aims?

President: I do

Chaplain: On behalf of the congregation, we thank you for your commitment. – [shakes hands]

ENROLMENT OF CAPTAIN

If the company is in a period with no captain, they can leave this piece out.

Chaplain: I'd like to ask the Captain of our company [insert name] to come forward. [Insert name] as captain of our company, you have been called by God to work with the children and young people in our company. Will you, by prayer and personal preparation seek to equip yourself for this service and by your work and example, strive to advance Christ's Kingdom, working in partnership with the church to share the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Captain: With God's help, I will

Chaplain: I now enrol you [insert name] as Captain of [insert name of company] Boys' Brigade in this congregation. May God give you grace to be faithful to him as you lead our Boys' Brigade company. [shakes hands]

ENROLMENT OF LEADERS

[Some companies prefer to enrol their leaders and helpers in groups, others enrol them as a collective. These words act as a guide and should be amended as appropriate.]

Chaplain: Can all leaders and helpers in [insert name of company] please come forward?

As you serve within our Boys' Brigade company, will you, by prayer and personal preparation seek to equip yourself for this service and promise by your work and example, strive to advance Christ's Kingdom, working in partnership with the church to share the gospel of Jesus Christ?

Leaders, helpers: With God's help, I will

Chaplain: I now enrol you as leaders and helpers of [insert name of company] Boys' Brigade in this congregation. May God give you grace to be faithful to him as you lead our Boys' Brigade company. [shakes hands]

ENROLMENT OF BOYS

Chaplain: I'd like to ask all boys and young men who attend Boys' Brigade to please stand.

I'm going to ask you all a question and the answer I'd like you to give is '**we do.**'

As members of [insert name of company] Boys' Brigade we want you to enjoy your time in the company, to develop friendships and learn new skills. Do you promise to listen to the leaders, try new things and be a good friend to the other members?

Boys: We do

Chaplain: Finally I have a question for the congregation. The answer I'd like you to give is '**we do.**'

Do you promise to support the work of [insert name of company] Boys' Brigade and to pray for the leaders, helpers and boys as they meet each week?

Congregation: We do

Chaplain: Let us pray for the work of Boys' Brigade.

Father, we give thanks today for the work of Boys' Brigade, for its call to advance Christ's Kingdom. We bring before you this Boys' Brigade company and we ask that you would give to it greater power to advance your Kingdom in this community and beyond. Lord give to the Captain and leaders wisdom and discernment in an increasingly challenging world, to make decisions worthy of you Lord.

Grant in your mercy that every member, may prove sure and steadfast in their fight against evil, and true in their walk with our Saviour Jesus Christ. Help us in times of temptation: make us strong where we are weak; give us courage in difficulty, faithfulness in duty, loyalty in friendship; and finally by your mercy, bring us into your everlasting kingdom when we trust in Jesus as our Saviour and Lord who is the Captain of our faith.

Amen

ALTERNATIVE FORMAT TO SUIT A JOINT ENROLMENT SERVICE FOR BOYS' BRIGADE AND GIRLS' BRIGADE

Boys' Brigade and Girls' Brigade are important ministries within [insert church name] and we are delighted to welcome boys, girls, young men and young women to the BB and GB companies every week.

CHAPLAIN

The purpose of The Northern Ireland Boys' Brigade is the advancement of Christ's Kingdom among Boys and the promotion of habits of Obedience, Reverence, Discipline, Self-respect and all that tends towards a true Christian manliness."

The aim of the Girls' Brigade is to help girls to become followers of the Lord Jesus Christ, and through self-control, reverence and a sense of responsibility, to find true enrichment of life.

During this part of the service, we will enrol the leaders, children and young people. This simply means we acknowledge the service of the leaders and helpers, we formally welcome the boys, girls, young men and young women and we commit the work of Boys' Brigade and Girls' Brigade into God's hands, asking his wisdom to guide us and his blessing as we work with children and young people.

ENROLMENT OF CHAPLAIN

Some companies may ask a member of the church leadership to enrol the Chaplain.

Member of church leadership: Being called by God to the work of caring for and training young people, will you, by your word and example, seek in this place to create a community of Christian love through which our Saviour, Jesus Christ, may make himself known and the young people may grow in the knowledge and love of God?

Chaplain: With God's help, I will

Member of church leadership: I now enrol you as chaplain to our Boys' Brigade and Girls' Brigade companies. [shakes hands]

ENROLMENT OF COMPANY PRESIDENTS

[Some companies have a President for their company]

Chaplain: I'd like to ask the President of our BB company [insert name] and ask the President of our GB company [insert name] to come forward.

As Presidents do you promise to continue in your support for our companies and their aims?

President: I do

Chaplain: On behalf of the congregation, we thank you for your commitment. – [shakes hands]

ENROLMENT OF CAPTAINS

Chaplain: I'd like to ask the Captain of our BB company [insert name] and Captain of our GB company [insert name] to come forward. [Insert name] as captain of our BB company, and [insert name] as captain of our GB company, you have been called by God to work with the children and young people in our companies. Will you, by prayer and personal preparation seek to equip yourself for this service and promise by your work and example, to serve our organisations to help young people become followers of Jesus and to promote the aims of the Girls' and Boys' Brigades?

Captain: With God's help, I will

Chaplain: I now enrol you [insert name] as Captain of [insert name of company] Boys' Brigade in this congregation and [insert name] as Captain of [insert name of company] Girls' Brigade in this congregation. May God give you grace to be faithful to him as you lead our Boys' Brigade and Girls' Brigade companies. [shakes hands]

ENROLMENT OF LEADERS – BOYS' BRIGADE

I'm going to ask you all a question and the answer I'd like you to give is **'we do.'**

As members of [insert name of company] Girls' Brigade we want you to enjoy your time in the company, to develop friendships and learn new skills. Do you promise to listen to the leaders, try new things and be a good friend to the other members?

Girls: We do

CONGREGATION

Chaplain: Finally I have a question for the congregation. The answer I'd like you to give is **'we do'**.

Do you promise to support the work of [insert name of company] Boys' Brigade and [insert name of company] Girls' Brigade and to pray for the leaders, helpers, children and young people as they meet each week?

Congregation: We do

Chaplain: Let us pray for the work of Boys' Brigade and Girls' Brigade.

Father, we give thanks today for the work of Boys' Brigade, for its call to advance Christ's Kingdom and for the work of Girls' Brigade and its call for young women to seek, serve and follow you. Lord give to the Captains and leaders wisdom and discernment, in an increasingly challenging world, to make decisions worthy of you Lord.

Grant in your mercy that every member, may prove sure and steadfast in their fight against evil, and true in their walk with our Saviour Jesus Christ. Help us in times of temptation: make us strong where we are weak; give us courage in difficulty, faithfulness in duty, loyalty in friendship; and finally by your mercy, bring us into your everlasting kingdom when we trust in Jesus as our Saviour and Lord who is the Captain of our faith.

INVITATION SUGGESTIONS

WHAT IS AN ENROLMENT?

Suggested text which can be used in the invitation sent to parents/ carers.

Our enrolment service brings together our Boys' Brigade members, leaders, parents/ carers and members of the church family. All boys will be participating in the service and you will hear more about the work of the BB company in [insert church name]. It's a great opportunity to join together to worship God through prayer and singing, to celebrate the leaders and members of Boys' Brigade and to hear teaching from God's word, the Bible.

Why not ask your younger boys to make invitations to give to their family?

PRAYERS

The wonderful thing about prayer is that it is unique and personal. Praying is having a conversation with God, it helps develop our relationship with him and he invites us to tell him whatever is on our mind, and that includes our cares and our worries. Prayer should be at the centre of our walk with Jesus and should be part of our weekly programme. An enrolment is an opportunity to get the boys involved in prayer.

BBNI is part of the ministry of the church and it's such a blessing when the church prays for its BB company, leaders, helpers and members. An enrolment is a great opportunity for the boys to lead some of the prayers, it may be appropriate to encourage the company/senior members to write their own prayer if they feel this is something they could do.

Here are some examples of prayer outlines the BB could use during the service. These can be amended to suit your company and church:

Anchors:

- Give thanks for:
 - the Leaders
 - the friends in BB
 - for all the fun they have at BB
 - God's love

The boys could learn a short prayer and say it in the service.

The boys could draw things to be thankful for and these could be made into a display for use in the church entrance at the enrolment or scanned into a Powerpoint and displayed while people are arriving at the service.

Sample prayer:

Thank you God for this day. Thank you for BB and all the friends we have made. Thank you for our leaders and be with us today and keep us safe this week. Amen.

PRAYER HANDS ACTIVITY FOR YOUNGER BOYS

These sheets can be used as an activity to help younger boys talk to God and understand prayer.

Instructions:

- Print out the template below.
- Fold the A4 page in half and cut around the hand shape, but do not cut through the middle of the hands. It will look like a butterfly when finished.
- Encourage the younger boys to write or draw what they want to pray to God about in the middle of the inside of the hands.
- They can then close the hands together to make praying hands and can colour them in and decorate the hands.

Juniors:

- Thank God for the fun and games at BB.
- Pray for the work of the church.
- Pray for the community around them.
- Thank you God for loving us.

Sample prayer:

Dear God, we want to thank you for bringing us all together today. Thank you for the Boys' Brigade that we get to come and have fun each week and learn about you. Thank you for the church and how they help us, thank you for our leaders who work hard to teach us. Thank you God that you love us and we pray for everyone in (town/city name) that you will bless us and keep us all safe. Amen.

Company/Senior

- For the work of BBNI across Northern Ireland and Donegal.
- For the leaders who give up their time to volunteer.
- For peace in the world and that people would know that there is a God who loves them, particularly during times of conflict
- For those who are sick or unwell.
- For the King and government.

Sample prayer:

Dear God, thank you for allowing us to come together today to worship you and to celebrate the work of the [insert name of company] Boys' Brigade. We thank you Lord for the work of the Boys' Brigade in Northern Ireland and Donegal which aims to share the Gospel to boys and young men from all backgrounds and communities. We pray Lord that leaders will continue to plant seeds into the minds of all who attend and that through your Holy Spirit, they will one day come to know you as their saviour and friend.

We thank you for all the hard work our leaders put into coming each week to lead BB, for giving up their time to faithfully serve you and use the gifts and talents that you have given them.

We often take for granted that we can freely have a relationship with you and there are other people who have to hide their faith because it is illegal in their country, we pray now for your love to be with them and to keep them safe.

We pray for your love over our world Lord and pray for healing for those who are sick or unwell and need your comfort today. We pray for those who couldn't be here with us and ask Lord that you will put your loving arms around them and bring them back when they are able.

We finally pray Lord for your protection and blessing as we leave here today into the new week ahead, that you will be with us and keep us safe. In Jesus name we pray Amen.
