The challenge

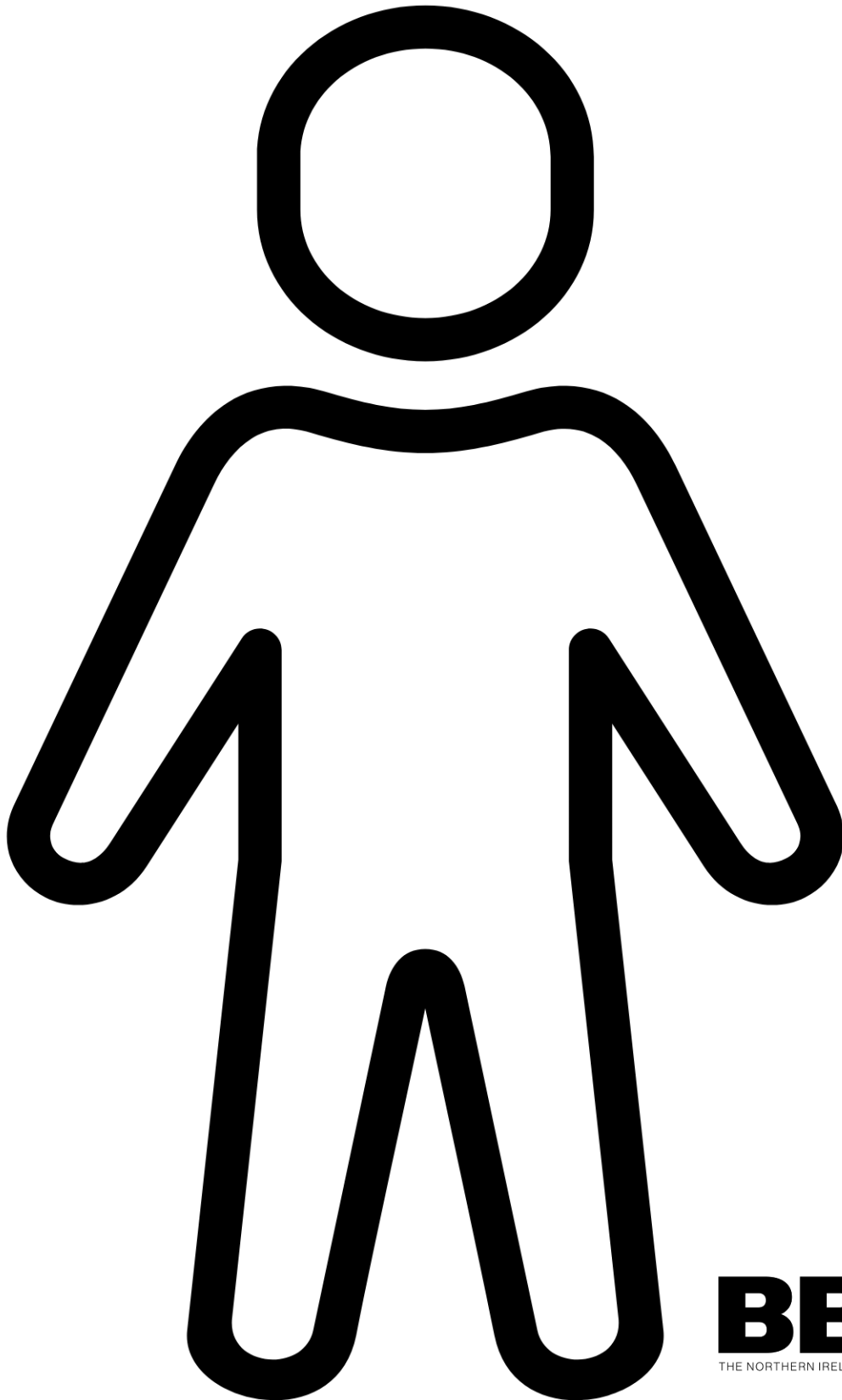
